# **Crown Valley Estates** Home Owners' Association **Board Transition Is Official**

### Here's to new chapters and beautiful outcomes in 2025!

It's official, Crown Valley Estates, as a community, begins 2025 having successfully transitioned from a developer-officiated Home Owner's Association to a residential Board of Directors, voted in by CVE residents on January 1, 2025. A quorum was established with 62 ballots or proxies, only by 22% participation, but a decent and necessary number for us to establish neighborhood governance.

With the election complete, Steven Weiss, Ed Hadfield and Josh Shelman have been selected by a majority for the 2025 election. Angela Webster will remain in her position on the board, until the October 2025 election when her term is up for renewal. Other residents have indicated there willingness and abilities to support in the areas of financial transparency, and engineering concerns relative to water & runoff management. All residents are encouraged to become active participants with the HOA.


The new CVE team board is looking forward to meeting and working with the community for a bright future, a safe neighborhood, and to resolve many long-standing concerns.
